

What will I find in the SMART Lessons?

CAPS-aligned content	SMART Lessons are CAPS-aligned and cover the essential content, concepts and skills required in the curriculum. Working examples and solutions have been provided where relevant.
Formative assessment	Formative assessments are Multiple Choice, True or False, or Yes and No questions. These questions assess learners' understanding of essential concepts, allowing teachers to gauge understanding and adjust the pace of the lesson. Questions appear both as standard SMART Notebook® screens and as SMART response 2 assessments.
Interactive activities	Interactive activities are provided in the form of SMART labs. SMART labs provide an opportunity for teachers to engage learners in the learning process and review critical concepts.
Exam questions	Actual exam questions and their worked solutions have been included. These provide teachers an opportunity to practice exam questions with learners.

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How do I match the SMART Lessons to CAPS?

A CAPS-alignment sheet has been provided for each subject, indicating which components of CAPS are covered in which SMART Lesson.

What makes SMART Lessons easy to use?

Vocabulary	SMART Lessons are CAPS-aligned and cover the essential content, concepts and skills required in the curriculum. Working examples and solutions have been provided where relevant.
Table of contents	Headings and other key components of the SMART Lesson appear in the Table of Contents, with links to the relevant section.
Answers to formative assessment questions	Answers to formative assessment questions are provided in a yellow pull tab.
Teacher notes	Teacher notes appear in a red pull tab.
Cell shading	Cell shading 'hides' certain sections of text, allowing teachers to discuss concepts before revealing them on the screen. Simply tap the grey block to reveal the text.
Dual page display	In some cases, teachers will need to move to Dual Page Display to view two screens side-by-side. A teacher note to this effect has been included where relevant.
Pin page	In some cases, teachers may need to 'pin' a particular page to view it side-by-side with a multitude of screens. A Pin Page icon has been included in these cases.
Locked content	All content in the SMART Lessons has been locked for the teacher's convenience. Content can be unlocked if necessary.
